

VICTIM'S ASSISTANT RESOURCES

Boulder County Resources

1. Victim Advocates:
 - a. Walk-in to speak with an advocate 10am-7pm (7 days a week) located at 2855 N. 63rd Street, Boulder, Colorado 80301. No appointment needed. For assistance needed after hours, call Boulder's dispatch at 303-441-4444 and they can connect you with a victim's advocate.
2. Family Assistance Center (FAC):
 - a. Victims or family members whose vehicles were left in the parking lot and who have the keys, may go to the Chase Bank, located at 603 S Broadway between 9am – 5pm to retrieve vehicles. Law enforcement officials on scene will coordinate this pickup.

All people who have been directly affected by the tragedy can visit the Family Assistance Center at VIA Mobility, 2855 63rd St, Boulder, CO 80301. They are open from 10 a.m. – 7 p.m. daily through at least March 28, with additional days to be determined. Information on victim compensation, personal affects, funeral expense support, behavioral health support and other resources will be available. Therapy dogs will be on site and food and water will be provided.

VICTIMS ASSISTANCE AND PERSONAL ITEMS RETRIEVAL

If you have not already retrieved your vehicle, please contact the Boulder Office of Emergency Management at 303-217-0120 to retrieve your vehicle. If you do not have keys to your vehicle, the Boulder Police Dept. will contact a locksmith to assist you in obtaining your vehicle.
