## **UFCW LOCAL 7 REACTS TO NLRB'S DECISION TO ALLOW UNION VOTE AT JBS GREELEY**

**DENVER – Kim Cordova, President of UFCW Local 7, which represents 3,000 workers at the JBS meat processing plant in Greeley, Colorado, issued the following statement:**

“UFCW Local 7 is pleased by the NLRB’s decision to allow the six classroom trainer employees at the JBS Greeley plant to vote on joining our existing bargaining unit. JBS’ false argument that the classroom trainers are supervisors or managers is categorically untrue and absurd, as is the fact that they wanted these employees to vote in person with a JBS supervisor present during another COVID-19 outbreak at the plant where six of our members died of COVID and over 500 have contracted it.”
