Bargaining Update

You, our Local 7 union members, have been showing up in person through a pandemic to care for patients while the company made billions. Yet, the Company refuses to meet in person for bargaining despite the loosening of COVID restrictions.

Local 7 discussed various issues such as inclement weather (our big March storm), vacation denials, and CE denials to which the company had no response. Local 7 advocated for the use of APPs (Physician Assistants and Nurse Practitioners) in a team-based model instead of the high-cost physician-heavy model the company plans for. The response was “crickets”.

While Local 7 advocates for its members, Kaiser leadership has very little response and it’s not clear if KPCO leadership is engaged in the process at all. The company’s main interest continues to remain cost. Local 7 proposed for its members to receive ACLS but the company questioned why this was necessary or needed.

We must stay UNION strong together to fight for what’s right for our members and patients. It is through solidarity that we show our power!! Stay engaged! Stay informed! You are the UNION!!
